

## Ruffled Toddler Scarf



This is quick pattern I made up using the same concept as my Toddler Scarflette, but I think that this construction is easier and less bulky. Unfortunately, the ruffle makes it a bit girly, but if you left it off, you could definitely use this for a little man. Please let me know if you have any questions or comments.

*Rating: beginner*

This pattern uses standard US abbreviations

Fsc: foundation single crochet. A great tutorial for it can be found at <http://crochetme.com/tips/foundation-single-crochet-photo-tutorial>

### Materials:

- .25 skein worsted weight wool, such as Bernat Satin (main color = MC)
- .1 skein worsted weight contrast yarn, such as Bernat Satin (contrast color = CC)
- Crochet hook, US J/6.0 mm
- Yarn needle

### Strap

In MC, Ch 15

Row 1: Sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> from hook, dc in next. Repeat across, ch 1, turn.

Row 2: Sc in first dc, dc in next sc. Repeat across, ch 1, turn.

Row 3-4: repeat row 2.

Turn 90 degrees, hook at the top right corner. Do not fasten off.

### Main Scarf

Continue in MC

Row 1: Ch 4, sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, and in next 2 chains. 6 sc across short edge of strap, then 3 fsc (link tutorial) ch 1, turn. (12 sc/fsc in total)

Row 2: Sc in first sc, dc in next. Repeat pattern across. Your scarf should resemble a T shape. Ch 1, turn.



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Row 3: Sc in first dc, dc in next sc. Repeat pattern across. Ch 1, turn.  
Row 3 -11: Repeat row 3.



Row 12: Sc in first dc, dc in next sc, repeat twice. Sc in next dc, bring up loose end of strap behind work and work remaining stitches of this row into both row 7 and the loose end of strap. Continue pattern of dc into sc and sc into dc. Ch 1, turn.

Continue as Row 3 until piece measures approx 20 inches. Do not fasten off.

### Ruffle

Still in MC, work 2 dc into the front loops only of each stitch in the last row. Turn scarf over. Working in the back loops only of that same row, 2 dc in each stitch. Sl st to first dc.

This will give you two ruffled rows worked into the same finishing row of the scarf. Fasten off.

*Note: If you want your ruffle to be fuller, add another round of 2 dc into each dc of the first ruffle round.*

### Edging

Using CC, attach yarn to edge of ruffle. Ch 1, sc in each dc around. Sl st to first sc. Fasten off.

Attach yarn to other short edge of scarf. Work 12 sc evenly across edge of scarf (this will include folded edge of strap). Fasten off.

Weave in all loose ends and admire the lovely scarf you've made. Now try to get a toddler to hold still long enough to try in on!
