

## Toddler Scarflette

This is a quick scarf for a small person. A great way to use up your scraps of worsted weight yarn. No buttons or knots required for this pattern as the end of the scarf tucks through a small sleeve on the reverse side.

*Rating: beginner*

This pattern uses standard US abbreviations

### Materials:

- .25 skein worsted weight wool, such as Bernat Satin (main color = MC)
- .1 skein worsted weight contrast yarn, such as Bernat Satin (contrast color = CC)
- Crochet hook, US F/3.75 mm
- Stitch marker
- Yarn needle



### Notes:

*I made the sleeve part with the contrast color because I was using up yarn scraps, but it would look nice done in the main color as well.*



*This pattern could easily be adjusted to fit a larger child or adult by adding extra rows in the main body of the scarf.*

Special stitch: **extended single crochet** (esc)

Hook through next stitch, yarn over and pull loop back through the work (2 loops on hook). Yarn over, pull through first loop on the hook (2 loops on hook). Yarn over, pull through remaining 2 loops on hook.

### Main section

Using MC, ch 82

Row 1: dc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, \*esc in next ch; dc in next ch\*. Repeat pattern across. (66 dc).

Row 2: ch 2 (counts as first stitch throughout), turn. \*Dc in next esc, esc in next dc\*. Repeat across.

Row 3-8: Repeat row 2.

Row 9: Repeat row 2, but on last yarn over of the row, use CC to complete the stitch. Cut tail for MC and weave end in. Continue in CC.

Edging: continuing in CC, ch 1, sc in each stitch along the long edge of the scarf. At corner, sc 3 times and continue along the short edge of the scarf. Stitch 9 sc evenly along the short edge, sc 3 in corner. Sc in each stitch along the other long edge of the scarf. 3 sc in corner. 9 sc evenly across short edge. Sl st to first sc. Do not fasten off.

Sleeve Row 1: ch 2, turn. \*Dc in back loop of next sc, esc in back loop of next sc\*. Repeat 5 times (11 stitches)

Sleeve Row 2: ch 2 turn. \*esc in next dc, dc in next esc\* repeat across. (11 stitches)

Sleeve Row 3: ch 2, turn. \*dc in next esc, esc in next dc\* repeat across.

Sleeve Rows 4-10: Repeat Edge Rows 2 & 3, ending with Edge Row 2

Sleeve Row 11: ch 1, turn. Fold Sleeve portion back on main body of scarf. Yarn over with MC and, continuing with MC, sl st across main scarf to secure sleeve to main. This will create your scarf sleeve. Fasten off. Cut and weave in all remaining ends.
